The National Council are pleased to advise that the first CILTNZ Leaders for the Future programme will be launched in Auckland on the 12th March.

This is a unique new initiative launched by CILT in New Zealand. It will enable our sector leaders to develop their understanding of leadership issues confronting the industry, and to develop their leadership capabilities for dealing with the challenges of the future. The programme is focused upon conversations with industry leaders across New Zealand.

It is the first time that our senior leaders have had the opportunity to participate in a programme designed especially for the industry.

The programme will be facilitated by Jo Brosnahan, a previous Chair of CILT in NZ, and former Chair of Leadership New Zealand.
