Grading requirements

A candidate needs to meet levels of education and experience, and knowledge of transport and logistics.

The **knowledge areas** are:

Core Generic Areas	Specialist Key Knowledge Areas
A. Integrated strategic planning, management and systems thinking	S1 Supply Chain Management S2 Operations Management
B. Efficiency, quality and risk	S3 Procurement and Supplier Management S4 Logistics Systems
C. Technology, analysis, adoption and monitoring	S5 Transport Infrastructure and Network Planning S6 Passenger Movement
D. Society, sustainability and the global community	S7 Freight Movement S8 International Trade and Transport

The extent these are required, and the level, rises with the grades. The levels are (a) Awareness (b) Understanding (c) Competence (d) Expertise. Category 5	Transport/logistics programme of advanced diploma level (accredited by CILT NZ) or other relevant exempting qualifications	3 years' junior management experience
Category 6	Non-degree/diploma	6 years relevant experience with at least 2 years at the management level

In addition, an MILT candidate needs to demonstrate competence in two of the Generic areas, and Understanding of the other two, with no specialist area knowledge required.

Category 4	Non-transport/logistics degree (not accredited by CILT NZ)	5 years of which 2 at managerial level
Category 5	Transport/logistics diploma (accredited by CILT NZ) or other relevant exempting qualifications	5 years

In addition, a CMILT candidate requires Competence in all the generic areas, and Expertise in at least one area. As well, the candidate should have Competence in at least one of the 8 Key Specialist Areas.

Chartered Fellow (FCILT)

Election Route	Practical Experience
Direct Election	 Exemption of the 7 years' qualifying experience or prior Chartered Membership in exceptional cases, notably by:
	 Eminence, the holding of a unique position of responsibility and/ or influence in connection with a national or international body or organisation involved in logistics and transport
	- Special Knowledge, knowledge of such a depth or knowledge in a particular area that few other people have
	 Outstanding contributions or commitment to make such contributions to the achievement of the object of the Institute/ to the logistics and transport sector.
Upgrade from CMILT	Should ordinarily have at least 7 years high-level management experience in the logistics and/or transport sector

In addition, there is a knowledge requirement of Expertise in at least one of the Generic areas and one of the specialist areas.

Specialist areas

There are specific relationships between grades and military ranks, master mariners, and senior public service levels. In addition gradings in similar organisations can be considered. These specialist areas will be taken into account by the Grading Committee in relevant cases.
